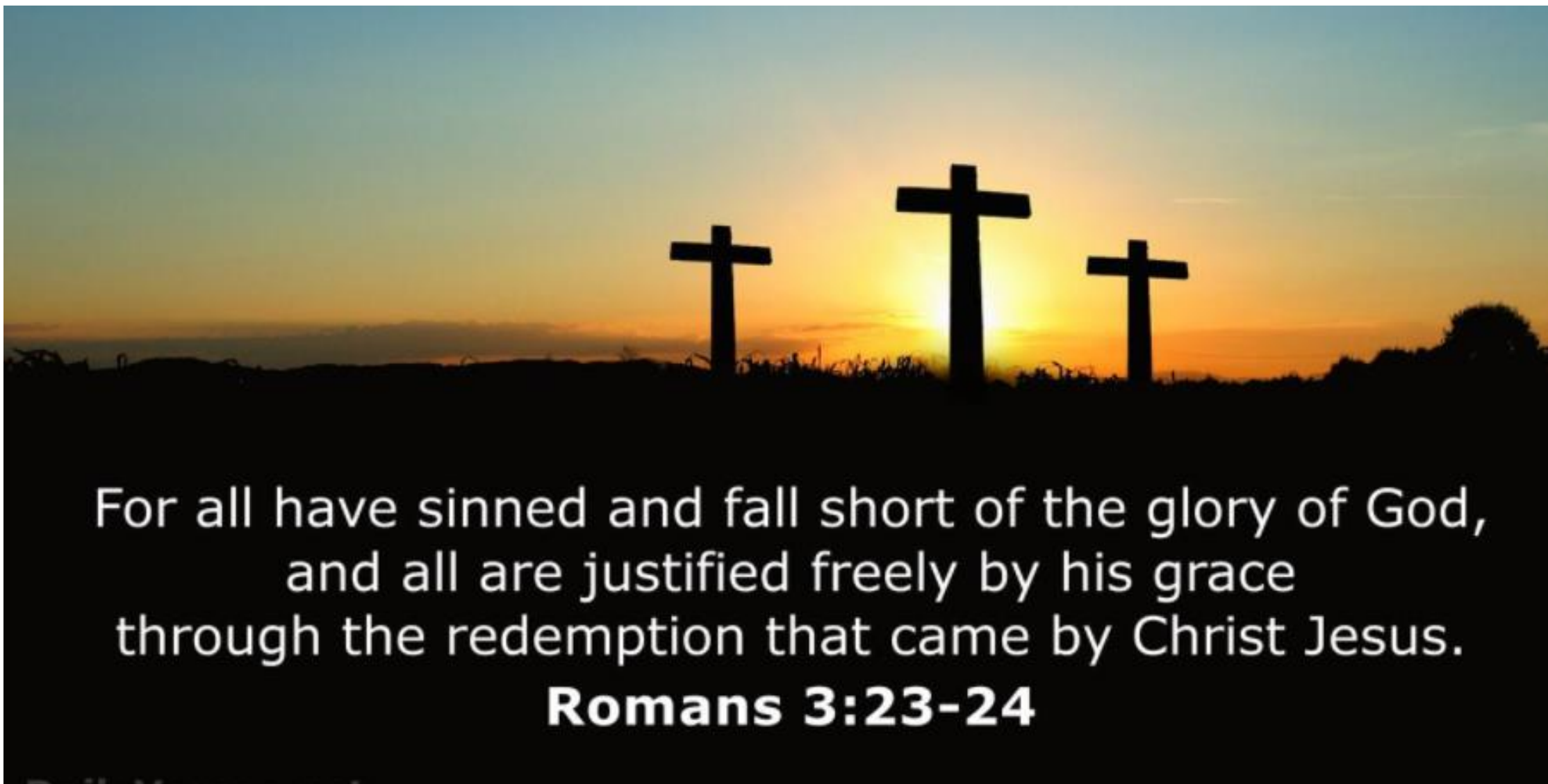

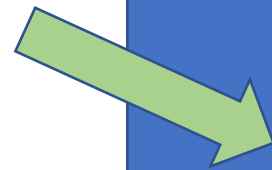

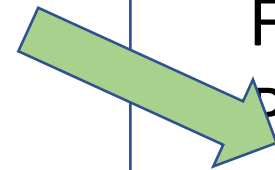

³⁸ For I am **persuaded** that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. NKJV

²⁵ God presented **Christ** as a **sacrifice of atonement**,^[i] through the shedding of his blood—to be received by **faith**. He did this to demonstrate his **righteousness**, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished— ²⁶ he did it to **demonstrate his righteousness** at the present time, so as to be just and the one who **justifies those who have faith in Jesus**.

²⁷ Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. Because of what law? The law that requires works? No, because of the law that requires **faith.** ²⁸ For we maintain that a person is **justified by faith apart from the works of the law.** ²⁹ Or is God the God of Jews only? Is he not the God of Gentiles too? Yes, of Gentiles too,

³⁰ since there is only one God, who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through that same faith. ³¹ Do we, then, nullify the law by this faith? Not at all! Rather, we uphold the law.




